
KOKOMO PRIVATE ISLAND FIJI

If you really do need an excuse to finally visit Fiji – does anyone, really? – you’d do well to let the immense charms of Kokomo Private Island Fiji draw you in. A peerless mix of untouched beauty and relaxed luxury, Kokomo Private Island Fiji is a stunning 45-minute flight by seaplane or helicopter from Nadi International Airport. Located on Yaukuve Levu Island, south of Suva, the island is surrounded by the Great Astrolabe Reef, one of the world’s largest barrier reef, which ensures you’ll find world-class diving and fishing with captivating marine life and coral.

Onshore, you’ll find spectacular white sand beaches as well as 21 Beachfront Villas and five Luxury Residences, all complete with private infinity pools and gardens, and where privacy is assured and service impeccable. This is your personal slice of paradise, so feel free to do as much or little as you like. The water activities are, of course, breathtaking, while the Yankuve Spa Sanctuary is, quite rightly, a haven of relaxation.

Sunset cruises are memorably romantic, and a boat ride to nearby Kudavu Island will reveal a hidden waterfall oasis. CAPELLA UBUD, BALI

A dazzling endeavour that brilliantly balances tranquillity and adventure, Capella Ubud, Bali is located in dense rainforest on sloping terrain leading to the sacred Wos River in Keliki Village. Here, nestled at the heart of lush green forests, is a unique tented camp that sits in harmony with the surrounding nature. Within are 21 one-bedroom tents as well as one two-bedroom lodge, all with private salt water pools, large outdoor decks, and indoor and outdoor bathrooms,

featuring a hammered copper stand-alone bath. Inside each individually styled tent, timeless charm, including handpicked antique furniture and artefacts, wooden carved doors, Balinese *poleng* and *ikat* linen, meets modern convenience to make sure you lack for nothing.

The Officers Tent, exclusively reserved for camp residents, is the camp's living room and library, while Mads Lange, the camp's split-level tented dining room, serves up seasonal and sustainable



dishes created using locally-farmed ingredients and influenced by the historical spice trail. Auriga Wellness, spread across three wellness tents as well as in-retreat nomadic therapies and treatments, offers a diverse choice of pampering, healing journeys and adventure wellness. A perfect nightcap to the evening would be at the daily Camp Fire, where you can meet a local storyteller or historian, or catch a silent black and white movie. capellaubud.com

HÔTEL DE BERRI, PARIS

True, Paris hardly needs another luxurious hotel but every city, we believe, deserves something like Hôtel de Berri. The Luxury Collection hotel, part of Marriott International, is located on the historic rue de Berri in the fashionable eighth arrondissement, a short walk away from Champs-Élysées and Parc Monceau in the heart of the Triangle d'Or shopping district. Previously a 1970s office building, the hotel sits on the site of what was formerly the residence of Princesse Mathilde Bonaparte and legendary couturier Elsa Schiaparelli.

The reimagined space exudes a unique atmosphere and timeless elegance, with eclectic, refined and bold interiors that pay tribute to 20th century French decorative arts. The individually decorated 75 rooms – 35 of which are suites – are engaging yet homely, replete with vibrant colours, paintings and antique furniture.

The Italian restaurant Le Schiap – apropos the address' former occupant – fittingly features a large fresco celebrating Parisian *joie de vivre*, while the bar, Le Bizzaz, is a highlight of Neoclassical reliefs and craft cocktails. Le Bizzaz also overlooks the hotel's private garden, a miraculously preserved 3,000 sq m landscaped garden. A calm and cool oasis in an urban setting, Hôtel de Berri is pet friendly as well – just something else to love it for. marriott.com

AWEI PILA, MERGUI ARCHIPELAGO

It's always great to discover new destinations, especially one so close to home. The Mergui Archipelago lies off the far southern coast of Myanmar. Comprised of hundreds of islands, with coral reefs and uninhabited beaches, it's a haven for birds, notably the plain-pouched hornbill, as well as marine life like dugongs and turtles. The secluded Pila Island is located in the Mergui Archipelago and is 80km offshore, north-west of Kawthoung, literally the furthest south you can drive in Myanmar. A two-hour speedboat ride from the mainland, Pila is nestled among a labyrinth of some 800 islands, atolls and coral reefs, which were, until recently, a haven only to wayward mariners, pirates and a handful of indigenous Moken or 'sea gypsy' fishing families.

The newly opened Awei Pila features 24 air-conditioned tented villas fronting a white-sand beach, an open-air restaurant, and spa. The isolated beach is surrounded by virgin forest with views out to the open

Andaman Sea. The natural bay embraces a 600m long beach front, which is divided into two by a large rock formation that adds to the privacy. There isn't a great deal to do here, which is part of its charm. The island has a single source of fresh water, 10 as yet unexplored sandy beaches, a host of birds, and coves alive with fish, dugongs and turtles. The local village boasts a rickety wooden pier, a Buddhist temple and a single beach-shack bar with a pool table. Barefoot luxury at its finest, we say. aweipila.com

ANDBEYOND TENGILE RIVER LODGE

Opened just last month, andBeyond Tengile River Lodge is located in the game-rich Sabi Sands Game Reserve in north-east South Africa. Adjacent to the world-renowned Kruger National Park, Sabi Sand is famed for its intimate wildlife encounters. Home to a host of animals, including the Big Five (lion, leopard, elephant, buffalo and rhino), Sabi Sand is part of a conservation area that covers



over two million hectares. With no boundary fences between Sabi Sand and Kruger National Park, this reserve benefits from the great diversity of animals found in one of the richest wildlife areas on the African continent.

Meaning 'tranquil' in the local Tsonga language, andBeyond Tengile River Lodge is situated on a bend of the Sand River. Built with an

extremely light footprint, Tengile will feature nine suites that are raised above ground level to give the impression that they are floating over the riverbed. The spacious suites will offer sunken lounges, elegant bedrooms and ensuite bathrooms (with indoor and al fresco showers) that open out into the forest, creating private spaces in the open air. andBeyond.com

WALDORF ASTORIA BANGKOK

FAIRMOUNT MALDIVES SIRRU FEN FUSHI

In a place where the spectacular is a norm, it does take something special to be truly exceptional. One of the most beautiful destinations in the world, the Maldives is spoilt for choice when it comes to luxurious hospitality. The Fairmont Maldives Sirru Fen Fushi, on the Shaviyani Atoll in North Maldives, however, makes a compelling case of being *primus inter pares*, boasting a 200m long swimming pool that bisects the island, connecting Onu Onu, the beachfront bar, crafted entirely of bamboo by Balinese artisans, on the west coast to the Willow Stream Spa in the east.

This direct connection between rejuvenation and libation is hardly the only thing the resort has going for it. There are 120 villas here, including luxury safari-style tented villas nestled in the island's lush


interior jungle, all complete with a private pool, while copper bathroom fittings and carved wood detailing on furniture lend them a bohemian rustic chic vibe.

Surrounded by abundant sea life and a pristine coral house reef, Sirru Fen Fushi, which means 'secret water island' in the local Dhivehi language, regularly welcomes manta rays, turtles, and bottlenose and spinner dolphins in the crystal-clear waters of its 600ha lagoon – the largest resort lagoon in the Maldives. As an added bonus, the 9km long house reef, directly accessible from the beach, is also, uniquely, home to a manta ray cleaning station, a perfect opportunity to see this majestic display of aquatic symbiosis with smaller sea life. fairmont-maldives.com



While this sun-kissed island in the Aegean Sea attracts nearly 1.5 million visitors a year, crowded is the last thing you'd feel in Canaves Oia Epitome. That, partly, is due to its location above the picturesque fishing town of Ammoudi, north of the town of Oia in Santorini. This

THE ROOMS OF ROME, ITALY



The Rooms of Rome is housed in the Palazzo Rhinoceros, a refurbished 17th-century palazzo in the city's Velabro quarter that is now the new seat of the Fondazione Alda Fendi - Esperimenti. Along with offices for the foundation, the six-floor palazzo will also have spaces devoted to exhibitions, research and experimentation, as well as a rooftop terrace that offers stunning views of Rome, especially of the Forum Boarium, The Arch of Janus, the splendid church of San Giorgio al Velabro, the temple of Hercules Victor and the Palatine Hill.

The 24 residences, spread across two floors of the palazzo, range from studios to two-bedroom apartments, and are all uniquely designed, with sleek furnishings standing in stark

contrast to the rough, unfinished walls. Each apartment comes with a patented, customised steel box that unfolds to reveal kitchens, bathrooms or cabinets. As a finishing touch, the top two floors of the palazzo houses Caviar Kaspia, the Franco-Russian inspired Paris restaurant.
