Best for luxury

### Kokomo Private Island Resort

\$\$\$ From \$3625

From the capacious beachfront villas with private gardens and infinity pools to the faultless, produce-driven cuisine and attentive service, Kokomo ([hotel.qantas.com.au/kokomofiji](http://hotel.qantas.com.au/kokomofiji)) gets it right on all counts. Whether you do nothing or the lot, this is the island resort par excellence, its relative isolation granting guests the pleasure of partaking in a wide range of sea- and land-based experiences in a pristine environment. Even the traditional welcome and farewell (including the famous *Isa Lei*) sung by staff are a cut above – the gentle, sweetly harmonising vocals lingering in the memory. **TONY MAGNUSSON**

Best for wellness

### Vomo Island Resort

\$\$\$ From \$1598

There's no FOMO on Vomo. Tropical dreams are realised in glorious colour on this lush triangle isle of coconut palms, mango trees and hibiscus bushes, fringed by coral reef and topped by an erstwhile volcano. Situated between the Mamanuca and Yasawa island groups, Vomo ([hotel.qantas.com.au/vomoisland](http://hotel.qantas.com.au/vomoisland)) caters to a maximum of 100 guests and benefits from the luxury of space – there's a nine-hole pitch and putt course on the landscaped grounds and much of the 103-hectare island remains untouched. There's a resident yogi, plus a yoga deck, as well as fitness instructors, gym, tennis court and a spa to unwind and relax in. **TM**

Best for romance

### Nanuku Auberge Resort

\$\$ From \$845

Spread along three kilometres of seaside on Viti Levu's Coral Coast, this 223-hectare property is part of the Auberge Resorts Collection ([hotel.qantas.com.au/nanukuauberge](http://hotel.qantas.com.au/nanukuauberge)) and offers loved-up guests a rich menu of activities to enjoy together. Claim the white sands and coconut palms of tiny Nanuku Island – a short boat ride away – for a *Cast Away*-style day of snorkelling, fishing and swimming. Back at the resort, you can embrace tranquillity with a couples massage on an elevated platform built around a 70-year-old dilo tree, before repairing to your room for a candlelit bath with hibiscus petals. **TM**

Best for families

### Radisson Blu Resort

\$ From \$290

Sitting pretty on four hectares with a panoramic ocean outlook, Radisson Blu ([hotel.qantas.com.au/radissonblu](http://hotel.qantas.com.au/radissonblu)) makes family holidays a cinch thanks to its well-sized rooms, four restaurants, climate-controlled network of pools (complete with waterslide, sunshades and adults-only lagoon) and a full schedule of activities for children. With Blu Banana Kids Club open from 9am daily, there's ample time for parents to enjoy a little pampering – why not indulge in a coconut and lime blossom body peel or Fijian Bobo massage at Harmony Retreat Day Spa? **TM**
